From the President

Accreditation forms have been circulated, accommodation for the more than 2,500 athletes and officials allocated, sports venues tested, computer systems working, just a handful of indications to approaching the big international event. Only three months until it is time for the Opening Ceremony of the 1997 Lahti World Games.

The Organising Committee have expanded their offices as each day more staff are being added while from 21st July they will operate from the World Games Centre at a school building located in the centre of the main sports venues. In the meantime, attention is being increased for the public awareness in Finland about the World Games event. In the last two weeks of April, two or three times a day promotional spots were broadcast on Finnish TV. The entire TV broadcast with a cost of FIM 150,000 was sponsored by the (inter)national communications firm Nokia, the Finnish mobile network Radio Linja and the Lahti local telephone company PHP. A great initiative for which we all are extremely grateful.

To the Lahti Organising Committee we thank you for all the hard work you have done up till now for the successful running of the 5th World Games

This issue of World Games News is focused on many details of the organisation of the 1997 World Games and will also be distributed to national federations involved in the hope that with further inside circulation it will also reach the athletes coming to Lahti. I wish them in particular all the best in the coming months and sincerely hope that their hard training will be successfully rewarded. Good luck and see you all in Lahti!

International TV coverage

More international TV contracts ensure more transmission of the TV coverage of the Lahti World Games, by the host television YLE, to households all over the world. Recently also Argentina TV company Torneos signed up for 15 hours. At an earlier stage Trans World International (TWI), the firm selling the TV rights outside Finland, made agreements for transmission in Europe, Russia, Australia, South Korea, Singapore and South Africa.

Collector's items

At the World Games Village, and also at other venues during competitions days, pins, T-shirts, caps, backpacks and waistsacks will be for sale. For the amount of FIM 20, each twelve pins are available showing the Lahti mascot acting as a specific athlete, e.g. in Aerobics, Fin Swimming, Floorball, Korfball, Life Saving, Military Pentathlon, Parachuting, Powerlifting, Roller Skating or Squash. A pin with the plain Lahti Mascot or with the Lahti logo costs the same.



A true collector's item is a bigger size Lahti Mascot pin with lighting (batteries changeable), FIM 35.--. Prices for the garments differ from FIM 50, for a waistsack to FIM 150, for a backpack.

Tourist Information

In Finland live approximately 5 million people with a population density of 17 per square kilometre. Lahti, established in 1905 and located in the southern part of the country and around 100 kilometres north of Helsinki, has about 95.000 inhabitants and is a commercial centre for the surrounding area with about 200.000 people.

In August the average weather conditions in the Lahti area are a daytime temperature of 18°C, sunrise at approx. 5.15 am and sun set at approx. 9.25 pm.

The Finnish currency is markka (FIM). The approximate rates of exchange are: US\$=FIM 5.0333, GB£=FIM 8.021 and DM=2.9895.

International credit cards accepted in Finland are Visa, Eurocard, Access, MasterCard, Diner's Club and American Express.

Banking hours are on Monday till Friday from 09.30 am till 4.30 pm and post offices are mainly open Monday till Friday from 09.30 am till 05.00 pm. Shops are open daily from 09.00 am till 8.00 pm.

Public telephones at post offices, at the railway and bus station as well as at the market square. Most are both for coins and for cards. There are two different kinds of card phones in Lahti, the ones of the Finnish telephone company (Tele) and the ones of the local company (Avantiphones). Phone cards available at post offices and R-kiosks.

Transport

Further to two welcome desks at the airport, one immediately after passport control and the other after passing customs, the Lahti Organising Committee has arranged bus transport (with a duration of about an hour and a half) from the Helsinki Vantaa Airport to the main accreditation office at the World Games Centre and then to the accommodations. The costs for a return ticket are FIM 120, to be paid in advance through the International Federations, which should provide the Organising Committee with the travel details of their athletes.

A shuttle bus service will handle the local transport and in all accommodation venues time tables will be available.

Modifications to the competition programme

The number of days for the Tumbling event has been reduced from three to two, only on Monday 11th and Wednesday 13th August. Due to technical reasons the venue for Water Ski has changed from the more far away Lake Merrasjärvi to Lake Joutjärvi in the city and on which in July the 7th World Junior Canoe Championships will be held.

FROM THE IWGA

The meeting of the IWGA Executive Committee originally scheduled in Lahti for the second weekend of May has been postponed till Saturday 24th May. The day before the Co-ordination Group will meet to discuss various matters regarding the finishing touches by the organisation of the 1997 Lahti World Games.

The date for the 1997 IWGA Annual General Meeting is provisionally fixed for Friday 17th October, in conjunction with the also amended dates (now 16th - 19th October) for the 31st GAISF Congress - with as theme "Sport and Management" - and General Assembly, both to be held in the Mercator Halle in Duisburg (GER).

FROM AKITA (JPN)

With the IWGA President Ron Froehlich present, the Organising Committee for the 2001 World Games will be formally established in Akita City on Thursday 3rd June. The ceremony will also be attended by the Governor of the Akita Prefecture but due to the outcome of recent elections Mr Kikuji Sasaki (Liberal Democratic Party), leading the Akita delegation to the 1996 IWGA General meeting in Monte Carlo last October, is succeeded by Mr Sukeshiro Terata (New Frontier Party). Governor Terata was formerly the Mayor of Yokote City in the southern part of Akita Prefecture.

A delegation of the Organising Committee, together with representatives of the Akita Prefecture, intends to visit the Lahti organisers from 16th through 19th June to get an impression of the preparations for a World Games event.

Field Archery

Aerobics



The World Championships of Sports Aerobics discipline of the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG), of 1998 were awarded to Rome (ITA) and those of 1999 to Hannover (GER). This year's World Championships, 31st May - 1st June, in Perth (AUS) are the qualifying event for the 1997 World Games.

Body Building



A recent survey published in France shows Body Building is, according to the President of the International Body Building Federation (IBBF) Ben Weider interviewed in the March issue of the Houston Health & Fitness Sports Magazine, the number one of the most popular sports in France. In the same article Weider was quoted that to him a - hopeful - recognition of Body Building by the IOC is of more priority than an immediate participation in the Games.

Bowling



The Brunswick Indoor Recreation Group will contribute, manufacturer of bowling lanes and boat builder, will contribute US\$ 1 million as the exclusive sponsor of the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs' (FIQ) campaign for bowling's inclusion in the 2004 Olympic Games. Next push toward this goal will be the installation of a unique arena setting for the finals of the 2nd East Asian Games, May 10-11 in Pusan (KOR). At last year's Olympic Games as well as those in 1992 Brunswick made a 12-lane facility available to all participants in the Games.
