1997 WORLD GAMES LAHTI (FIN)

Medals

At the annual GAISF meeting sets of medals of the 5th World Games were presented to IOC Member, President of GAISF and IWGA Hon.

Founder President Dr Un Yong Kim, and to IWGA President Ron Froehlich.

IOC Member HSH Prince Albert of Monaco also received a collection. In total about one thousand medals will be produced. On the front side of the awards is the logo of Lahti while on the reverse that of the IWGA is pictured.

TV Coverage

The host Broadcaster, YLE, will produce 45 minutes of daily highlights at 14.00 and 20.00 hrs and some live coverage of Aerobics, Bowling, Dance Sport, Floorball and Squash. Total cost for the production is about \$ 700.000 U.S.

Although negotiations by Trans World International (TWI) are still going on, the World Games will appear on pan-European cable and satellite sports service Eurosport (30 hours), Australian cable TV Fox Sport (8 hours), Russian sports cable network NTV (30 hours), Middle East satellite and pay-TV ART (30 hours) and South Korean cable network KBS (15 hours).

Mayor of Lahti chairs Organising Committee

Since recently the Mayor of Lahti Kari Salmi is acting as the President of the Lahti Organising Committee succeeding Seppo Valisalo. Earlier this year Kari Salmi showed his interest in the organisation for the 1997 World Games meeting the Co-ordination Group at his City Hall offices.

Finnair Official Carrier

The Finnish airline company Finnair will act as the official carrier for the Lahti World Games. To learn the traveling plans of the competitors and their officials all International Federations involved have been asked to contact the nearest Finnair office. Special fares for group traveling and overweight charges will be decided at a later stage.

During mid November most of the Technical Delegates appointed by the International Federations attended a meeting in Lahti organised by the Lahti Organising Committee. Main topic was the arrangements to ensure smoothly run competitions. Most likely another meeting will take place in Spring 1997.

By the end of November, the Finnish national federations of the sports on the World Games program were informed about the current state of affairs and their role in the 1997 World Games organisation.

FROM FEDERATIONS



AGFIS / GAISF

The 30th General Assembly of GAISF accepted a recommendation that the IOC should assist in the development of the World Games. This following to a Congress with as theme "Olympism in the 21st Century" at which one of the speakers was IWGA President Ron Froehlich.

Dr Un Yong Kim was unanimously re-elected as President of the GAISF Council as were Dr. Tamas Ajan as Vice President, Ron Froehlich as Treasurer, Peter Tallberg as Secretary General and Les McDonald, Gian Franco Kasper, Primo Nebiolo and Horst Schreiber as Members. Hein Verbruggen, a new Member, was elected to replace Etienne Allard who had resigned. Next year's GAISF Congress and General Assembly will take place in the German city of Duisburg from 1st to 18th October.

AEROBICS

In October the second World Championships of Sport Aerobics, conducted by the International Gymnastic Federation (FIG), were held in The Hague (NED). A total of 153 athletes (78 female, 75 male) from 31 nations took part. Individual medals went to **Isamara Secati** (BRA), **Juanita Little** (AUS), **Chloé Maigre** (FRA), and to **Kwang-Soo Park** (KOR), **Kalojan Kaloianov** (BUL), **daudio Franzen** (BRA).

Spain won the Mixed Pair competition with Brazil second and Russia third while Romania won the Trio event with Korea second and Hungary third. Next year's World Championships, in Perth (AUS) 31st May - 1st June, will be regarded as qualifier for the 1997 World Games.

BODY BUILDING

The Congress of the International Body Building Federation (IFBB), meeting in the Jordanian capital Amman in conjunction with the 1996 Men's World Championships, decided that as from the 1997

World Championships in Prague (CZE) the three medalists in each category will be drug tested as well as a number of randomly selected athletes. In 1998 all IFBB international events will be drug tested in this manner. Penalties for a positive test are two years for a first-time offence and life for a second offence. National federations are also sanctioned for sending non-tested athletes to international events. In the 1996 World Championships, held under the patronage of HM King Hussein and crown Prince Hassan, 60 countries participated with 176 athletes.



DANCE SPORT

For the second year in a row the Italians **Massimo Giorgianni** and **Alessia Manfredini** are World Champions in the Standard category.

This year's second place went to **Christopher Hawkins** and **Hazel Newberry** from England (finishing third last year) while the bronze went to another Italian couple, **William Pino** and **Alessandra Bucciarelli** (fourth in 1995).

The 1996 Latin World Champion is the German pair **Ralf Muller** and **Olga Müller-Omeeltchenko**. Silver went to **Michael Wentink** and **Beata Onofater** from South Africa while the Danish couple **Holger Nitsche** and **Charlotte Egstrand** took third.

SQUASH

Mrs Susie Sincock from New Zealand has become the first woman to be elected President of the World Squash Federation (WSF), after serving as its Vice President since 1989. Mrs Sincock is a Governor of New Zealand's SDOrts Foundation and an Executive Member of the country's Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association. By admitting three new countries - Colombia, Tanzania and Indonesia -, the WSF now boasts 111 members, looking after the interests of more than 15 million squash players worldwide.



TRAMPOLINE

As of 1st January, 1997 the President of the International Trampoline Federation (FIT) will act as President of ARISF, the organisation of Olympic Recognised Federations. Ron Froehlich succeeds the former Vice President of Squash Philippe Van der Ven.

At the ARISF AGM, 21st May in Lausanne, new elections will be held.

WEIGHTLIFTING

Women's Weightlifting has been accepted by the IOC as an event on the programme of the Olympic Games. Depending on further discussions between the IOC and the International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) the Women's competition might even be included in the Sydney Games in 2000.

President Kevin Weldon from Australia resigned for business reasons after being in this position since the foundation of the ILS. Until formal elections in 1998, the post will be held by Derek Whitting from South Africa currently Secretary of the ILS Sports Commission.

Revised Programme 1997 World Games

Recently the Lahti Organising Committee made additional changes to the programme for the 1997 World Games. The dates for Aerobics is now 15th and 16th and for Body Building 8th and 9th August. The two days competition of Dance Sport will now start on Sunday 10th August.

Due to decisions made at the recent Congress of the International Aikido Federation, their activities on the Demonstration programme will be limited to one day: Wednesday 13th August.

The amended programme reads:

A record 25 Member Federations attended the 1996 Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on 17th October in Monte Carlo. It was unanimously agreed to have the 2001 World Games hosted by the City of Akita Japan). Also unanimously the IWGA President Ron Froehlich had been nominated to represent World Games and other sports at the GAISF Council. Furthermore it was agreed that, prior to the outcome of a study for possible revision of the Constitution and Regulations as well as the World Games Rules, the date for nominations of athletes by name is amended to eight weeks i.e. no later than 7th June, 1997 instead of only 15 days before the start of the Games.

Next year's AGM will be held in conjunction with the 1997 GAISF Congress and Assembly, 15th - 18th October in Duisburg (GER).

2001 WORLD GAMES AKITA (JPN)

As stated in the Agreement between IWGA and the Akita Prefecture, the 2001 World Games will be held from 16th August to 26th August. No later than 1st April 1998, the Co-ordination Group (composed of representatives of IWGA and the Akita Organising Committee) will be established. This Group meets two times annually in 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001. A maximum of 2,500 athletes will be provided with three meals a day and free accommodation during the competition as well as for three days thereafter.
